Dear Contractor:

The Yakama Nation's Upper Columbia Habitat Restoration Project is requesting bids for construction of a **Salmon Habitat Restoration Project** to be implemented on Nason Creek in July of 2016. The project will involve all work elements and specifications found in the Project Plans.

Attendance at the pre-bid site visit is **strongly suggested**. The site visit will occur on **April 11, 2015 at 9:00 am** at the project log yard (**On Hwy 207 near Cole's Corner, from Hwy 2 go toward Lake Wenatchee, you will see the logs decked on the right**). This site visit will be conducted by Yakama Nation Fisheries Habitat Biologist Jason Breidert, who is the project manager.

By the close of business on **Thursday, April 27, 2016**, each contractor must have completed and submitted a signed copy of the attached LWP 2&3 Bid Tab. Bid prices will need to be valid for at least 180 days. All competitive bid materials must be sent by parcel delivery service or postal mail to:

1. Type in the following URL in the internet browser bar and hit ENTER to load page.

2. Read over web page to familiarize yourself with the project.

3. Scroll down to bottom of webpage to gain access to attached documents. Listed below are examples of the documents that you will be able to access and download online:

4. Once you locate the links for the attachments (located at the bottom of the webpage), you can download and access by doing the following:

- i. Left click on the desired link. The file should open in a new browser.
- ii. Go to the newly opened file, click on the "File" tab and choose "Save As". This will allow you to save your file to your computer and desired location on your computer.
- iii. Save all desired files for later access.

The project will be conducted between **July 16 and July 31, 2016**, to coincide with the in-water work window. This is a time of year when ESA-listed juvenile and adult salmon and steelhead may be present in or near the project area so turbidity control via cofferdam systems will be of the utmost importance. The winning contractor will understand the magnitude of this project and be equipped to perform all necessary elements for a project of this type within a critical habitat stream. The winning contractor will have extensive experience in the following: building cofferdams, de-watering following NMFS fish screening protocols, constructed log jams, excavating engineered channels and minimizing local disturbance.

All contractors submitting bids for this project shall provide and/or demonstrate, at a minimum, the following:

- ***A list of experienced equipment operators that will be on-site during project construction. Please provide details of their work on in-stream habitat enhancement structures within the past several years.***
- ***A detailed construction timeline of how you propose to get all project tasks completed within the permitting work-window timelines.***
- ***Experience and preferably examples of the ability to create de-watered work areas through the use of coffering techniques. A cofferdam and surface water diversion plan should be submitted with the bid documents.***

Please note:

- Davis Bacon Wages apply to this contract. The winning contractor will adhere to the Davis Bacon rules and comply and submit all necessary paperwork to the Yakama Nation.
- The Yakama Nation is exempt from state taxes on this project. Please see the attached Treaty Fishery Exempt Cover Letter and Treaty Fishery Exempt Certificate. The winning contractor will receive signed copies for their records.

- As referenced in Sheet 3 of the Construction Plan Set, a minimum 6” dri-prime diesel pump is required in addition to the other pumps.
- As referenced in Sheet 17 of the Construction Plan Set, acceptable minimum vibrasonic pile driving equipment shall include: hmc movax sonic side grip vibratory pile driver model sp80 or equivalent. Impact pile drivers will not be acceptable.

The attached Scope of Work Exhibit provides an overview of the scope of work likely to be incorporated into the awarded contract. Please make note of specific provisions provided in this Scope of Work Exhibit that may be in addition to the specifications and directions found in the Project Plan set.

Additionally, this project will occur on privately owned land. Construction access to the project site has already been pre-negotiated between the Yakama Nation and the landowners. Please do not trespass.

Awarded contractor must provide “san-i-can” service. Please note that this project is pending on permitting and final landowner permission.
